

Free Spray Dayz are Cardinals bring home medals from back for 2014 Portland meet

For the fourth straight spring, the Morrow Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) along with the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) will host "Free Spray Dayz" in Morrow County.

The event will take place locally in Heppner City Park on Friday, May 23, from 9 a.m. to noon.

During the last three annual events, Morrow SWCD Manager Janet Greenup says the organizations have given out nearly 800 gallons of pre-mixed, turf safe (one pass) weed killer to over 500 individuals. The chemical was donated by Morrow

County Grain Growers. Greenup says the herbicide is mixed by a licensed chemical applicator and comes in a labeled one-gallon container ready for use, including a Material Safety Data Sheet.

Also available is information on weed identification, conservation programs and various other educational materials. Participants must fill out a cooperative agreement.

Free Spray Dayz are also planned in Boardman in the NAPA parking lot on Monday, May 19, and in Irrigon City Park on Wednesday, May 21; both events are also 9 a.m. to noon.

The Cardinal track team did well this week despite being short in numbers; the lone team took only 13 to the Jo-High Invite in Joseph May 9 and eight to Portland for the PLS 1A Track Classic May 10.

The team turned out eight PRs, three SRs and six benchmarks (BM) in Joseph, followed by four PRs—including a tie with a previous PR—at the Portland meet. PRs and SRs are noted in the stats to follow.

In Joseph, the men placed sixth of eight teams and the women placed fifth of eight.

In Portland, the women placed third overall with 19 teams participating, even with only three women participating in the meet.

"We are extremely proud of their accomplishments," said lone Coach Paula Emmel.

The men placed seventh of 18 teams with only five young men participating.

"They also did the Cardinals proud!" Emmel said.

In fact, Ione's eight qualifiers made a very good showing in Portland. All

four members in field events advanced into the finals (top nine) and then placed on the podium, earning one gold medal, three silver medals, three bronze medals, a fifth, sixth, and two seventh-place ribbons.

In running events Hector Aguilar subbed in the 200M for Jorge Aguilar, who was recovering from an injury, and in the 1500M for Joshua Stillman, who was home ill; Hector ran a near-personal record pace in the 1500M against a very tough field.

Rachel Holland subbed in the 100M, running the race for the first time.

"We greatly appreciate their willingness to help the team by subbing for teammates who were unable to run," said Emmel.

Four of the five runners placed, bringing home a gold medal, a fourth-place ribbon and two seventh-place ribbons. Ione's two hurdlers brought home a gold and a seventh-place ribbon, as well.

In summary, Jessie Flynn brought home three gold and one silver medal. Emily Holland brought home a silver medal and two ribbons. Rachel Holland brought home a ribbon for her efforts. Oskar Peterson brought home a ribbon. Luke Jobes brought home two ribbons, as did Jorge Aguilar. Bailey Haguewood brought home one silver and three bronze medals.

Districts are this Saturday, May 17, at 11 a.m. in Moro, at the Sherman County High School.
