Joe G. Burleson, 87, of Heppner, died Sunday, July 6, 2014 at Kadlec Regional Medical Center at Richland, WA. A memorial service with military honors will be held 12:30 p.m. Saturday, July 19, at the United Methodist Church in Heppner.

He was born November 7, 1926 at O'Donnell, TX, the son of James B. and Billie Graham Burleson. He was raised in O'Donnell for a time and then the family moved to Tatum, NM, where he attended school. He joined the military during World War II and served with the United States Marine Corps. He next attended college for a time but then reenlisted with the Marine Corps, serving during the Korean Conflict. Following his honorable discharge he met his future wife, JoAnne Bono. On August 27, 1953 the couple was married at Delta, CO. The couple would have been married for 59 years next month.

They moved to Oregon in 1960. Legion, and the Elks Lodge.

Barbara belonged to the Lexington Grange, the Rebekah Lodge, VFW Auxiliary, and the Willow Creek Country Club.

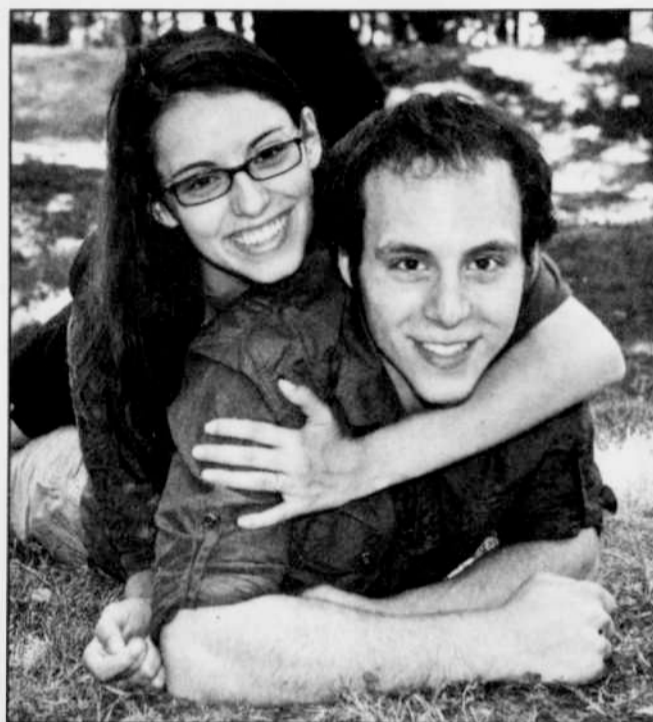
