Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Joseph Edward Kindle, 34, was convicted of one count of Arson in the First Degree, A Class A felony, and sentenced to 18 months prison time with the Oregon Dept. of Corrections with credit for time served. Kindle was also sentenced to three years post-prison supervision, to include mental health evaluation and sanctions including the possibility of additional imprisonment if terms of supervision are violated.

In addition, Joseph Edward Kindle, 34, was convicted of one count of Theft in the First Degree, a Class C felony, and sentenced to 18 months prison time with the Oregon Dept. of Corrections with credit for time served, time to run concurrent with sentence on a Burglary I charge (to follow). Kindle was also given two years post-prison supervision, to include mental health evaluation and sanctions including the possibility of additional imprisonment if terms of supervision are violated.

In addition, Joseph

Edward Kindle, 34, was convicted of one count of Felon Possess Firearm, a Class C felony, and sentenced to 15 months prison time with the Oregon Dept. of Corrections with credit for time served, sentence to run consecutive to the counts of Arson I and Burglary I. Kindle was also given two years post-prison supervision, to include mental health evaluation and sanctions including the possibility of additional imprisonment if terms of supervision are violated.
