A masterful entertainer, Miller performs nationally and has distinguished himself as one of the great

interpreters of American folk tales and folk songs. His performances appeal to all ages.

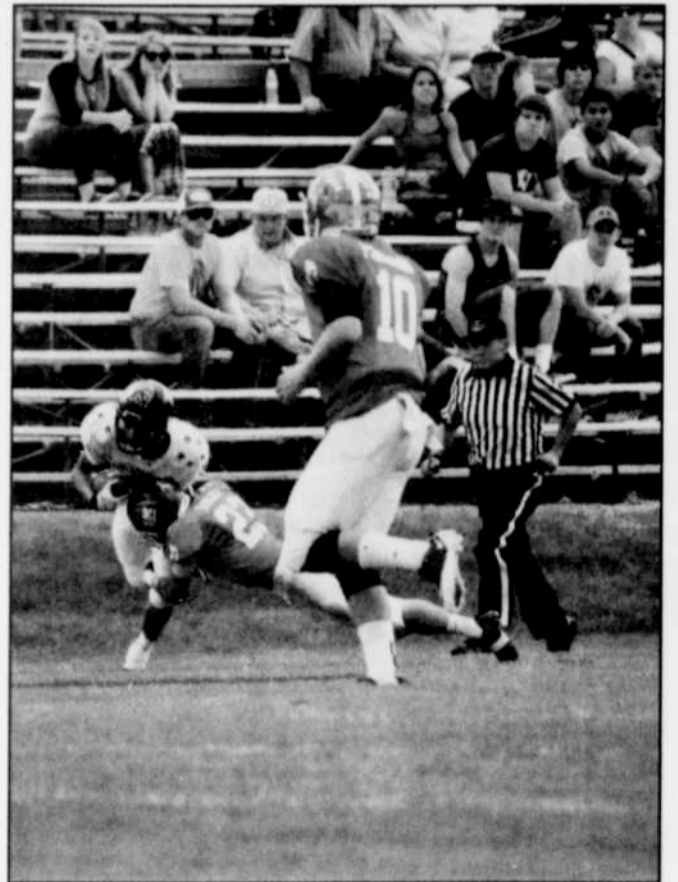
The Heppner program will be held at 10:30 a.m. on Aug. 15 at the Oregon Trail Library District's branch library.

## USDA extends deadline for ELAP

WASHINGTON— U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) Administrator Juan M. Garcia announced last week that the enrollment deadline for the 2012 and 2013 Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees and Farm-Raised Fish Program (ELAP) has been extended to Aug. 15. Originally, program sign-up was scheduled to end Aug. 1.

The new deadline gives livestock, honeybee and farm-raised fish producers who experienced losses because of disease, adverse weather, wildfires or colony collapse disorder between Oct. 1, 2011 and Sept. 30, 2013 an additional two

weeks to enroll in ELAP. "Because ELAP is an important safety net for key sectors of American agriculture, we've provided this two-week extension so that producers can submit

required documentation and apply for program benefits," said Garcia.

Producers are encouraged to contact their local FSA service center or

visit FSA's website at [www.fsa.usda.gov](http://www.fsa.usda.gov) for additional information regarding ELAP.

ELAP was authorized by the 2014 Farm Bill.

## DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Gary Dow Williams, 59, was convicted of Driving Under the Influence of intoxicants (DUI), a Class C felony, and sentenced to 15 months prison time with credit for time served. The defendant was also given two years post-prison supervision, to

include alcohol evaluation and attendance of a victim's impact panel. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$946.

-Gary Dow Williams, 59, was additionally convicted of Failure to Perform Duties of a Driver, Property Damage, a Class A misdemeanor, and sentenced to 180 days' jail time with credit for time served, sentence to run concurrent with the previous count. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$393.

-Gary Dow Williams, 59, was additionally convicted of DUI, a Class C felony, and sentenced to 12 months prison time with credit for time served, sentence to run concurrent with previous DUI count.

The defendant was also given two years post-prison supervision, to include alcohol evaluation and attendance of a victim's impact panel. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$691.

-William Eugene Stolz, 40, was convicted of one count of Theft I, a Class C felony, and sentenced to 24 months supervised probation subject to 90 sanction units with 30 jail units. Probation conditions include substance abuse evaluation, mental health evaluation, 3.75 sanctioned units used for 60 hours of community service, no contact with do-defendant, and completion of theft counseling. Stolz was also convicted of one count of Criminal Mischief I, a Class

C felony, and sentenced to 24 months supervised probation subject to 90 sanction units with 30 jail units. Probation conditions remain the same as above. Total fines, fees and assessments were \$891.

-In addition, William Eugene Stolz, 40, was convicted of Failure to Appear I, a Class C felony, and sentenced to discharge. Total fines were \$100.

-David Lynn Hickox, 55, was convicted of one count of Assault II, a Class B felony, and sentenced to 70 months prison time with credit for time served and three years post-prison supervision. In addition, the defendant was convicted of

one count of Possession of Methamphetamine, a Class C felony, and sentenced to six months prison time with credit for time served and to run concurrent with the previous count. Sentence included one year post-prison supervision. In addition, Hickox was convicted of one count of Menacing, a Class A misdemeanor, and was sentenced to discharge. In addition, the defendant was convicted of one count of Criminal Mischief II, a Class A misdemeanor, and sentenced to discharge. Fines, fees, assessments and restitution totaled \$36,750.03.
