

Justice Court Report

Morrow County Justice of the Peace Ann Spicer has released the following Justice Court report:

-Nicholas Dean Wolford, 27, Heppner, Failure to Appear/Failure to Register Vehicle, \$110 fine.

-Barbara L. Cutsforth, 61, Heppner, Failure to Use Seatbelt, \$110 fine; Failure to Carry Proof of Insurance, \$260;

-Treston Gregory Maiben, 18, Heppner, Careless Driving with Accident/Injury, \$435 fine, 100 hours community service to include activities related to driving improvement and providing public education on traffic safety, complete a traffic safety course, and one-year suspension of driver's license if other conditions are not met.

-Thomas Allen Gonty, 70, Heppner, two counts of Nuisance Abatement in violation of the Heppner Nuisance Code, with a \$50 fine on each count; ordered to clean up property in five days.

-Betty Ann Burns, 64, of Ione was found guilty of Violating the Basic Rule 80/55 and fined \$260.

DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Luis Alberto Nunez, 29, was convicted of Harassment, a Class B misdemeanor, and sentenced to 90 days jail time; however, execution of 30 days of incarceration was suspended and the defendant sentenced to one year bench probation, conditions of probation to include anger management and batterers evaluation and recommended treatment. Additional counts were disposed without conviction. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$750.

-Orin Andrew Whitbeck, 50, was

convicted of one count of Theft I, a Class C felony, and sentenced to 24 months prison time with credit for time served, sentence to run concurrent with previously imposed sentences, and to one year post-prison supervision. Additional counts were disposed without conviction. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$500.

-Juan Rodriguez, Jr., 18, was convicted of Robbery II, a Class B Felony, and was sentenced to 60 months in custody of Oregon Youth Authority, three years' post-prison supervision, and is subject to numerous conditions, including having no direct

or indirect contact with the victim and no affiliation with gangs or known gang members, wearing of gang colors, use of gang symbols or other gang-associated activity, and ordered to pay \$1,100 in fines, fees and assessments and pay \$100 in restitution. He was also convicted of Robbery I, a Class A Felony, and was sentenced to 60 months in custody of Oregon Youth Authority, three years' post prison supervision, with numerous conditions and ordered to pay \$200 in fines, fees and assessments. Two counts of Robbery I-firearm, Assault IV, Theft II and Strangulation were dismissed.

Boardman applies for ODOT special city allotment

During their Aug. 5 council meeting, Boardman City Councilors approved application to the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) for a Special City Allotment.

Boardman applied for construction of curbs and sidewalks for a future construction of a street that will be located between Falver Road and Chaparell Drive.

These special city allot-

ments total \$1,000,000 in funds dispersed by the DOT to cities with a population of 5,000 or less.

Forty-six small cities qualify for the allotments, which are to be used for street projects, not a part of the state highway system, that are inadequate, or are in a condition detrimental to safety. Each allotment will be for \$50,000 and will be dispersed for the 2015-2016

fiscal year.

In other city business, the city sold a parcel of land located near the city's waste water lagoons to Umatilla Electric for a radio tower.

The \$131,000 is earmarked for the new splash pad park project.

The next meeting of the Boardman City Council will be Tuesday, Aug. 19, at 7 p.m. at Boardman City Hall.
