NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on August 18, 2014 Boardman Rural Fire Protection District filed a ballot title in the Morrow County Clerk's Office, Morrow County, Oregon.
Caption: Boardman Rural Fire Protection District General Obligation Bond Authorization
Question: Shall the District issue general obligation bonds in an amount not exceeding \$13,715,000 for a new Emergency Services Station? If the

bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of Section 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.
Summary: This measure authorizes the District to issue general obligation bonds to finance capital costs to position the District to respond to the demands of its growing community. The projects proposed are:

- To purchase land and construct and equip a new fire station and training facility. This station will include housing for 24-hour firefighter staff, emergency medical technician (EMT) staff, and students enrolled in the Educational Sleeper Program who would supplement volunteers to reduce response times and increase staffing resources available.
- Pay bond issuance costs.

The bonds would mature in 31 years or less from the date of issuance and may be issued in more than one series. Current estimates indicate a cost of about 47 cents per thousand, or \$47 a year on a home valued at \$100,000.00. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY, based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of the estimate. Results may differ based on actual rates incurred and growth in assessed value. Any elector may file a petition for review of this ballot title in the Morrow County Circuit Court no later than 5:00 p.m., August 27, 2014 (7 business days after filing of this notice with the County Clerk).

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on August 18, 2014 Boardman Park and Recreation District filed a ballot title in the Morrow County Clerk's Office, Morrow County, Oregon.

Caption: Boardman Park and Recreation District Bond for community Recreational Facility

Question: Shall Boardman Park and Recreation District fund a Community Recreational Facility by issuing bonds in an amount not exceeding \$12,390,000? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Summary: The Boardman Park and Recreation commissioned a feasibility study for a multi-purpose recreation center and a survey showed community support of this project.

If approved, this measure is expected to fund a Community Recreation Center:

- Purchase land, construct facility and related improvements, furnish, provide equipment;
- Facility is expected to include a 25m six lane indoor swimming pool with slide, wave and therapy pool, gymnasium, climbing wall, indoor walking track, fitness center, aerobic room;
- Administrative offices, community meeting room, spectator seating, lockers, concessions, storage;
- Pay bond issuance costs

Bonds would mature in a period not to exceed 26 years from the date of issuance and may be issued in one or more series. The annual average tax rate for bonds is estimated to be approximately \$0.9549 per \$1,000 of assessed property value or \$95.49 per \$100,000 of initial taxable assessed value. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY, based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of the estimate.

Any elector may file a petition for review of this ballot title in the Morrow County Circuit Court no later than 5:00 p.m., August 27, 2014 (7 business days after filing of this notice with the County Clerk).
