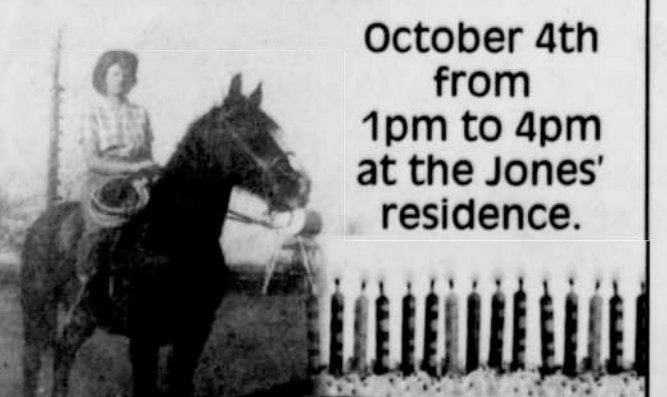
Chamber lunch meeting Chamber lunch to feature candidates' forum Oct. 16
