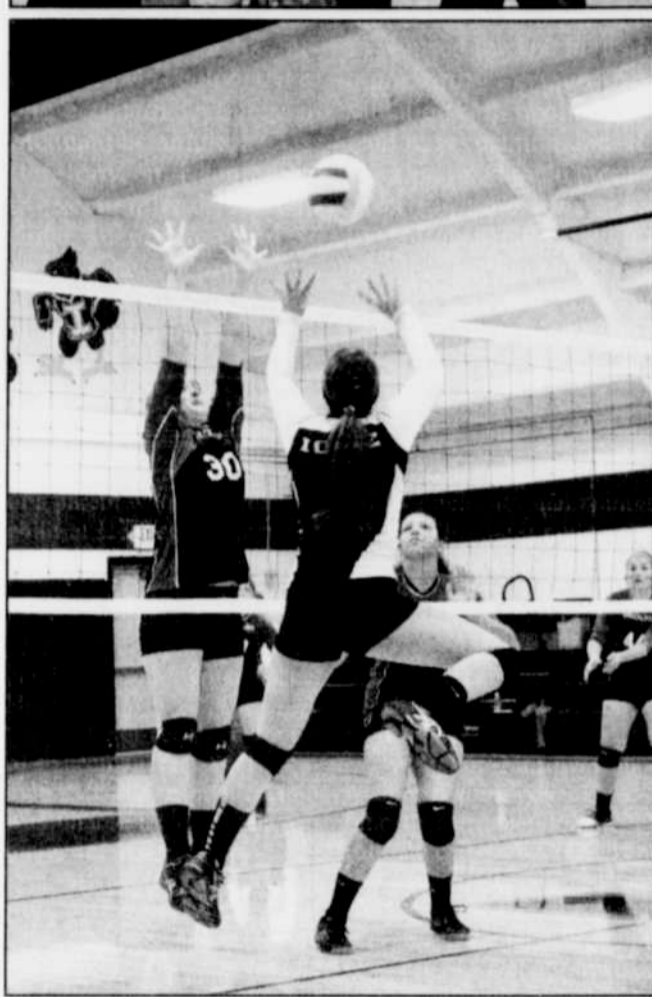

DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Dustin Dale Rollis, 34, was convicted of one count of Theft II, a Class A misdemeanor, and sentenced to 18 months bench probation, to include 40 hours of community service, a written apology to the victim, and no direct or indirect contact with the victim. Defendant may apply and be eligible for violation treatment upon

successful completion of probation. An additional count of Criminal Trespass II was disposed without conviction. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$893.

-Leobardo Solis Jacquez, 62, was convicted of one count of Delivery of Methamphetamine, a Class B felony, and sentenced to six months driver's license suspension and 36 months bench probation. Conditions of probation include enrollment in and

completion of Social Re-education/Life Skills training, no contact with certain individuals, 20 days jail time, and 180/90 sanction units with 10 sanction units to be used for 160 hours of community service. And violation of probation may lead to revocation and imposition of 25 to 26 months of prison time. One count of Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine was dismissed. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$600.
