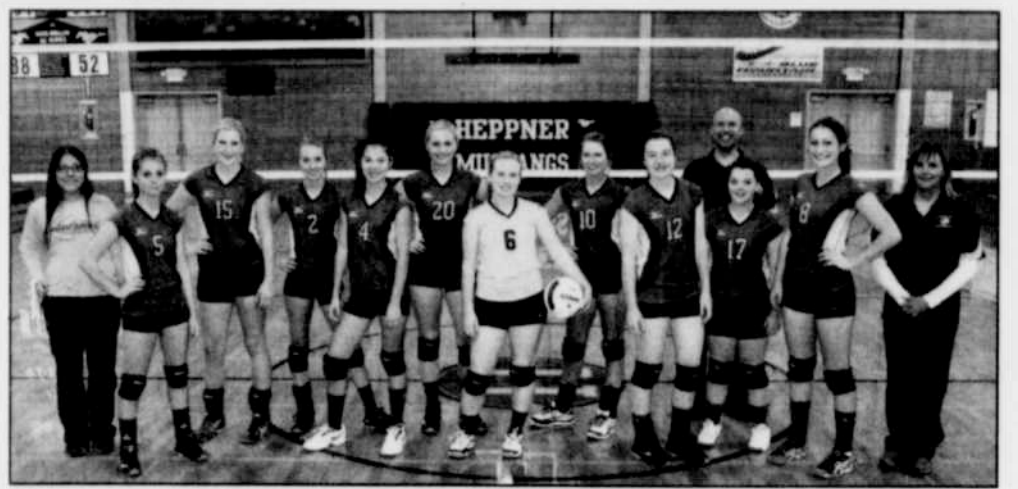
Heppner volleyball takes third in districts

The Heppner Mustang volleyball team ended its season at the Columbia Basin Conference District Tournament this weekend. The team entered as the third seed and finished the tournament in third place.

Heppner did win both of their matches on Friday, which allowed them to play for the conference title. They lost that match to the Culver Bulldogs, who were then named the CBC champions. The Mustangs then had to turn around and play the Weston-McEwen TigerScots for the second state playoff berth. Heppner had beaten the TigerScots 3-2 the day before, but lost to them in this match 3-0.

Heppner started tournament play with the Irrigon Knights and won that match 3-0 (25-18, 25-16, 25-13). Heppner served 62-69. Paige Grieb went 15-15 with three aces. Sophie Grant was also perfect by going 10-10 and Rylee Wagoner was 5-5. Kelly Wilson led the team in assists with 11 and Grant recorded nine. Morgan Correa had nine kills and Wilson followed with five. Jessica Kempkin finished seven, Maddie Lindsay and Grieb had two each. Wilson had three blocks, and Kempkin and Kaelyn Lindsay recorded two each. Grieb led the team in digs with 23. Lindsay had 19 and Wilson nine.

The Mustangs then played the Weston-McEwen TigerScots. Heppner won the match 3-2 (25-22, 10-25, 25-20, 23-25, 15-6). This was an exciting match that went back and forth all afternoon long. With the win, Heppner then got to play for the conference championship. For the match Heppner served 84-92. Correa went 16-16 and

Grant was 14-14. Lindsay was 24-25 with five aces and Grieb went 16-17 with three aces. Grant led the team in assists with 20, while Wilson added 11. Lindsay had 14 kills and Wilson 10. Kempkin had nine big kills and Correa finished with eight. Grieb once again led the team in digs with 56. Correa was next with 30 and Wilson had 23. Lindsay followed with 19 and Grant had 14. Kempkin had 10 blocks in the match.

On Saturday the Mustangs played the powerful Culver Bulldogs for the conference title. Heppner lost that match 3-0 (19-25, 17-25, 6-25). The Mustangs served 40-43. Lindsay and Grant both finished 8-8. Wilson went 6-6 and Grieb 8-9. Wilson had 14 assists in the match and Grant eight. Lindsay hit nine balls for kills and Kempkin followed with five. Correa scored four and Wilson three. Grieb led the team in digs with 31 and Lindsay followed with 28. Onna DeLoach was next with 15 and Wilson had 12. Kempkin had three blocks, Wilson and Correa had two each. With the loss, the Mustangs then had to play Weston-McEwen for the second state playoff berth.

It was another close match with the TigerScots.

Heppner ended up losing it 3-0 (24-26, 23-25, 21-25). All three sets were close until the very end. In the first set the score was tied at 24-24. In the second and third sets the teams were tied 23-23. Weston-McEwen was able to get the win on this day. The Mustangs served 57-64. Correa went 13-13, Grant 9-9 and Grieb 6-6 with two aces. Wilson had 12 assists and Grant finished with 10. Kaelyn Lindsay had two in the match. Maddie Lindsay hit the ball hard

in the match for 12 kills. Wilson and Correa had five each, DeLoach finished with four. Leading the team in digs was Grieb with 40. Maddie Lindsay had 25 and DeLoach 24. Wilson finished with 17. Kempkin recorded six blocks in the match, Wilson and Correa had three each.

The Mustangs finished their season with a 17-10 record overall and were 6-4 in conference play. They are ranked 16th out of the 43 teams in the state that play 2A volleyball.

Morrow County SD launches into app stores

HEPPNER—Staying updated on news and events from the Morrow County School District just got a bit easier for parents and community members thanks to a new Morrow County SD mobile app, now available for free download in the Apple and Google Play stores. The app is a way for the community to access MCS D information from mobile devices.

“We’re very excited to have this great new tool in our communication toolbox,” said George Mendoza, assistant superintendent. “We have a very active and supportive school community throughout our district,

so this will be a wonderful way to keep our public informed.”

The mobile app, developed by School Messenger—the district’s parent notification system—in coordination with InterMountain ESD, pulls information from the district’s website into a more mobile-friendly application easy to view on cell phones and tablets. Students, staff, parents and community members can now download the free app to gain instant access to school calendars, school lunch payments, student grades, news, a full directory and information on individual schools.

Each of Morrow County School District’s three unique communities of Boardman, Heppner and Irrigon can quickly access their respective high school’s schedules and information right from the home screen of the app.

Parents will be able to receive “push notifications” from the district with the app, meaning they’ll receive instant alerts on their mobile devices when important information about school—such as a closure or delay due to inclement weather—is released.
