HES celebrates healthy choices

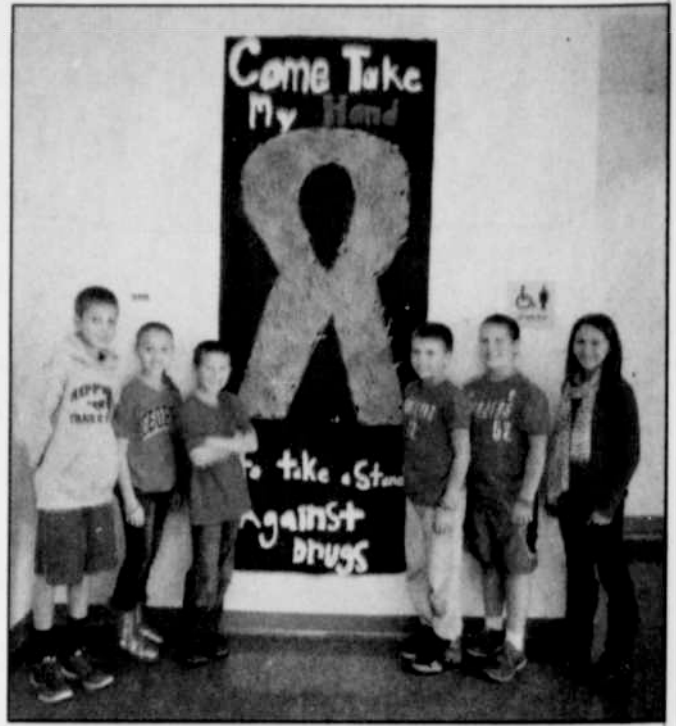

Students also entered a writing and drawing contest to explain how they have the power to be drug-free. The

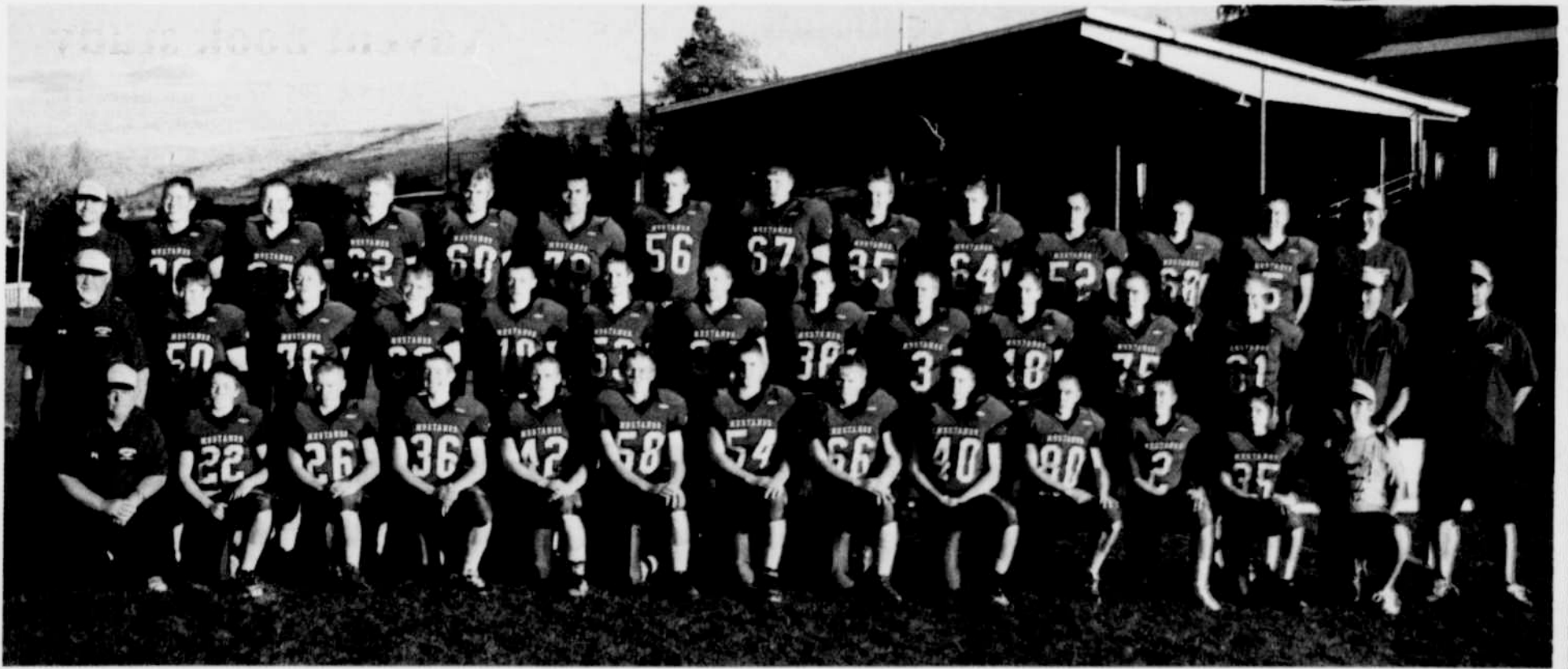
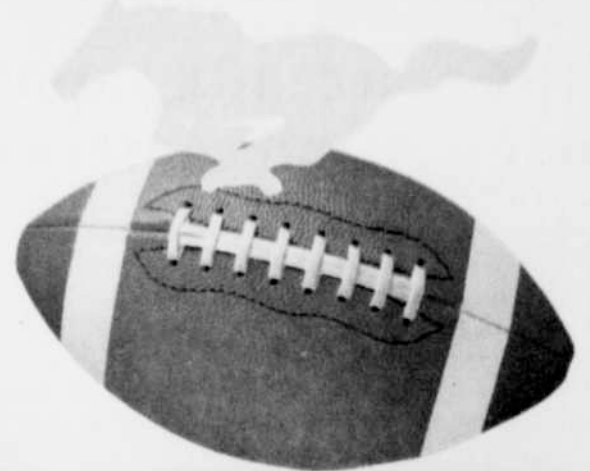
