Sheriff's Report

July 10: -Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report of a burglary in Irrigon.

-MCSO received report of a vehicle being towed on I-84 E, Boardman, that was on fire. Fire department, Emergency Services, Boardman Police officer and MCSO Deputy responded.
