4-H enrollment deadline Jan. 31

Volunteers needed to keep local programs going

The deadline is approaching to enroll in this year's 4-H programs.

For more than 100 years, 4-H has offered opportunities for youth and families to "master new challenges, experience growing independence, feel a sense of belonging, and to give back to our communities."

4-H is a positive youth development program and can provide partnership opportunities with families and volunteers to create an educational atmosphere within various project areas. These projects are tools to help youth learn life skills through competition, team work, community service, challenges, and success. Membership in 4-H is open to all youth ages five through 19. Levels include Cloverbuds, five to eight years of age on Sept. 1; Juniors, nine to 11 years of age on Sept. 1; Intermediates, 12-14 years of age

on Sept. 1; and Seniors, 15-19 years of age on Sept. 1 (ungraduated).

4-H opportunities include working with adult volunteers, working with a diverse group of youth as a team, feeling a sense of accomplishment, developing and practicing leadership, receiving recognition for their efforts, participating in a safe environment, service to others, and having fun.

There are numerous 4-H clubs around Morrow County with many diverse projects; independent study is also an option for projects without formal clubs. Popular projects for junior through senior levels include but are not limited to livestock projects such as beef, swine or rabbits; horse; home economics like sewing, cooking or Fashion Review; art projects; photography; sciences like outdoor sciences, aerospace, or robotics; horticulture and gardening; communications

projects like public speaking or creative writing; and leadership opportunities such as being a 4-H camp counselor, 4-H ambassador, or junior leaders.

For members ages five to eight, at the Cloverbud level, similar projects are available to those listed above. Contact the local office for complete details and information. Cloverbuds do not pay a registration fee to enroll in 4-H.

In addition to opportunities for new members, the Morrow County 4-H program is also seeking volunteers for this "learn by doing" program. Commitments can range from a year to a few weeks to one time only and can cover the gamut of interests and programs available.

To volunteer, choose a project of interest, complete a volunteer application and interview with an OSU Extension faculty member, and attend a new leader

training.

New leader trainings are planned for Monday, Jan. 26, from 6-8 p.m. at the SAGE Center in Boardman and Wednesday, Jan. 28, from 6-8 p.m. at the OSU Extension office in Heppner. Registration is required; call 541-676-9642

For new members or volunteers, sign up for 4-H now by contacting the Morrow County Extension Service, 541-676-9642. County member dues are \$5 per member and state member dues are \$18 per member with a \$36 family cap. Membership applications are accepted year-round, but in order to be eligible for fair, applications and enrollment fees must be received by Jan. 31.
