THE MORROW COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION will hold the following hearing of public interest on February 24, 2015 at 7:00 PM at the Port of Morrow Riverfront Center in Boardman, Oregon.

Conditional Use Permit CUP-N-315: Love's Travel Stops & Country Stores, applicants and City of Boardman, owner.

The property is described as Tax Lot 133 of Assessor's Map 4N 24 15, otherwise identified as Parcel 1 of Partition Plat 2012-13. The property is located on the southeasterly corner of Interstate Highway 84 and Tower Road interchange. The property is zoned Tourist Commercial (TC) with the Airport Approach Zone (AA) impacting a portion of the subject property. The request is to site a vehicle repair facility in the TC Zone and to allow a retail use in the AA Zone. Criteria for approval include Morrow County Zoning Ordinance (MCZO) Article 3 and MCZO Article 6.

After the public hearing, the Planning Commission will hear a guest speaker discussing the economic growth of Morrow County. They will then discuss the update to the Economic Element of the Morrow County Comprehensive Plan.

Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above proposal or to ask questions will be

provided. Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter or failure to provide sufficient specificity to afford the decision maker an opportunity to respond to the issue precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on those

**Sheriff's Report**

**August 30 (cont.):** -MCSO was advised of an individual causing a fight at Bucknum's in Heppner.

-A woman in Heppner reported that she was renting a room from a female subject in Heppner and that when she went home the locks were changed and her stuff was bagged up. The female subject advised her she would not be getting her belongings back. Caller requested a phone call to advise her of her options. A deputy made contact with the caller and advised her of her options and that this was a civil matter.
