DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:
-Tyler Richard Fernald, 34, was convicted of Aggravated Theft I, a Class B Felony, and sentenced to two years supervised probation, probation conditions to include 10 sanction units to be used for 160 hours of community service. Additionally, Fernald was convicted of Criminal Mischief I, a Class C Felony, and sentenced to two years supervised probation subject to 120 sanction units with 690 jail units. Probation conditions include 10 sanction units to be used for 160 hours of commu-

nity service. Fines, fees, assessments and restitution totaled \$125,457.65. -Cylie Lailani-Marie Hepton, 22, was convicted of two counts of Burglary II, A Class C felony. For each count, the defendant was sentenced to 14 months prison time with credit for time served, sentences to run concurrent with each other and with the following count and additional court cases. Defendant was also sentenced to one year post-prison supervision on each count, conditions to include substance abuse evaluation and no contact with co-defendants. In addition, Hepton was convicted of one count of Possession of Methamphetamine, a Class C Felony, and sentenced to six months driver's license suspension and 14 months prison time with credit for time served, sentence to run concurrent with previous counts and additional cases. Defendant was also sentenced to one year post-prison supervision on each count, conditions to include substance abuse evaluation and no contact with co-defendants. In addition, Hepton was convicted of two counts of Criminal Mischief II, a Class A Misdemeanor, and sentenced to discharge on both counts. Seven additional counts of Burglary II and eight additional counts of Criminal Mischief II were disposed without conviction. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$800.
