Obituaries

Lois Redding

Lois Redding, cherished mother of daughter Shari (Jerry) Sheehan and sons Randy and Kerry, grandmother of Michael Sheehan, and great-grandmother of Brecken Sheehan and Caden Sheehan, passed away peacefully on March 16, 2015 in Lake Havasu City, AZ. Lois was 95 years old. Her ashes will be buried next to her husband's at Heppner Cemetery.

Born in 1919 in the small community of Hardman in eastern Oregon, Lois and her brother Lowell grew up in a sparsely-populated area characterized by rolling hills of wheat farms, grazing livestock and the local trade center, a town of about 5,000 people, named Heppner. Their father Clair made his living as a machinist and equipment operator while their mother Faye attended to chores at home and cared for her children. A memorable social event growing up was Saturday night dances held at the Hardman Community Center, which the family attended regularly. Lois loved to dance.

Lois married Boyd Redding in Heppner on September 2, 1939. For their honeymoon they traveled with close friends Bernice and Jimmy Healy (also just married) to the 1939 World's Fair at San Francisco, CA. The Golden Gate Bridge had opened just two years prior. It was the first time either of them saw the ocean.

During World War II, Lois, an attractive young woman, worked as a welder and riveter in a Portland, OR shipyard while Boyd was a pilot overseas. After the war, Boyd and Lois moved to Santa Monica, CA where they enjoyed the beach and mild climate. It was there they started a family.

Lois was a devoted mother and housewife. She is remembered for numerous things. Among them are her love of her children, her patience, attentiveness,

kindness, predictability and persistence. She made delicious meals, not gourmet meals but rather the nourishing home-cooked variety. Some of the family's favorites were chicken fricassee, meatloaf, chicken enchiladas, scrambled eggs and toasted English muffins topped with fresh-frozen strawberry jam, and home-baked bread. Home was Lois's territory and she made it the best it could be.

After their youngest son Kerry left for college, Boyd and Lois exchanged their house in Santa Monica for a motor home and traveled across the United States, parts of Canada and Baja Mexico for more than 20 years. They enjoyed "being on the road," and saw nearly everything there was to see while dropping by occasionally to visit their kids, relatives and friends, including friends Harriet and Raymond "Bud" Batty of Heppner.

When Boyd died in 1999, Lois moved to Lake Havasu City, AZ to be close to daughter Shari and her family. Lois lived in a mobile home at DJ's trailer park. Her daily one-mile walks around the park and frequent visits to the grocers and bakery for her afternoon pastry earned her the nickname "The Roadrunner," given to her by neighbors. She had a reserved yet amiable disposition.

Lois spent the last few years of her long life at Lake Hills Inn, an assisted living facility in Lake Havasu City. As a private person who greatly valued her independence, this move was a difficult adjustment for Lois, although she was one not to outwardly complain. Her struggle with Alzheimer's and Parkinson's was mitigated by regular visits from her devoted and loving daughter Shari and occasional visits by her sons, grandson and great grandchildren. Lois will be missed by all who knew her.

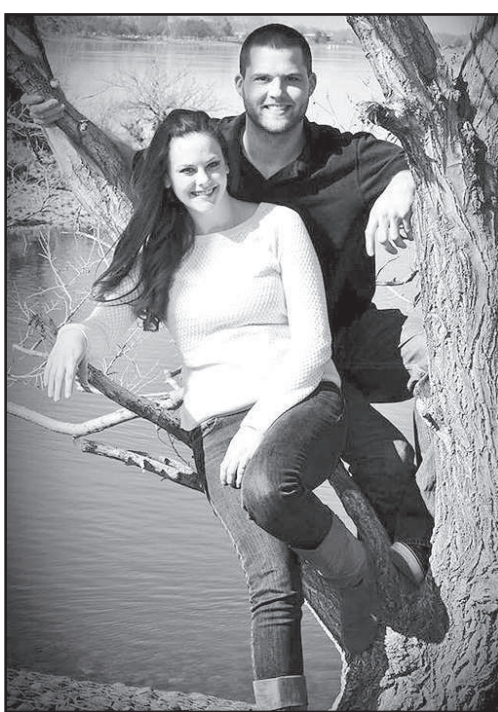

The bride-to-be is a graduate of Heppner High School and is currently employed at Costco in Kennewick, WA.

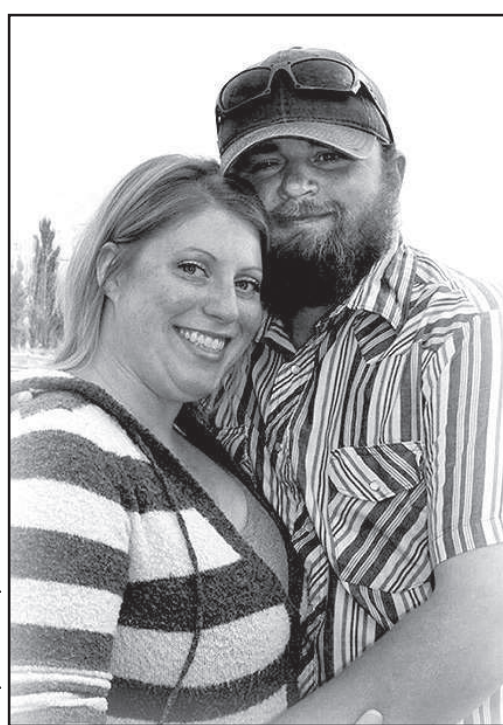

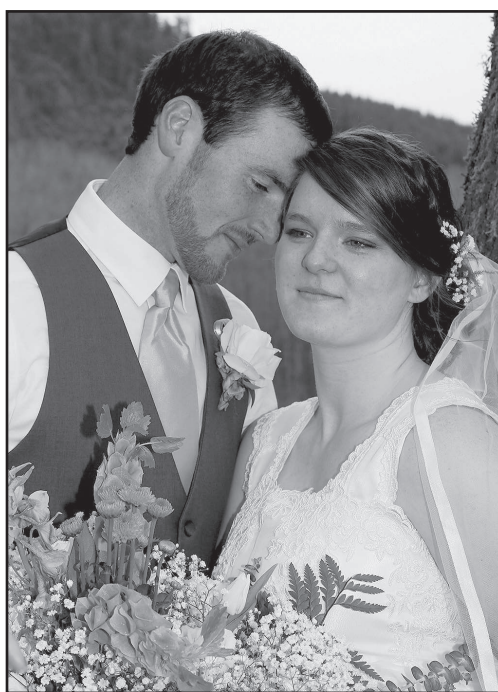


Hannah and Travis Bellamy
