Winning the tournament for the girls was Sophie Grant. She shot an 88 to finish in first place at the event. Following her were Paige Grieb and Maddie Lindsay, who both shot 94s. Grieb was awarded the second place medal on a scorecard tie-breaker. Maddie took home the third-place medal and Amanda

Rea shot a 101 to finish out the team scoring. Riane Dompier and Emily Rea also golfed for the Mustang team at the tournament.

Logan Grieb led the boys' team with a 78 and finished in second place overall. John Propheter took home the fourth place medal by shooting an 87 and Ross Cutsforth tied for fifth place with an 88. Brian Rill had a good day and rounded out the scoring for the team. Tommy Bredfield served as the alternate team member.

Both teams will travel to Union on Friday and participate in a large tournament that will be held at Buffalo Peak Golf Club.
