**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Port of Morrow, Oregon (the "Port"), will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, May 13, 2015, at 1:30p.m., in the offices of the Port, 2 Marine Drive, Boardman, Oregon 97818. The purpose of the public hearing is to provide an opportunity to hear public comment on a request by Kodiak Carbonic, LLC (the "Borrower"), for the issuance by the Port of its revenue bonds, in one or more series, issued either separately or together pursuant to a plan of finance, in the maximum aggregate principal dollar amount not to exceed \$6,500,000 (the "Bonds").

The proceeds of the Bonds will be loaned to the Borrower and used by the Borrower for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and equipping multiple structures to house process equipment, scales and temporary storage of the finished product, totaling approximately 6,000 square feet, which will process raw carbon dioxide gas currently vented as a waste product through a scrubber, dehydrator and compressor manufacturing a high purity liquid carbon dioxide stream for sale to industrial users to be located on land leased from Pacific Ethanol Inc. at 71335 Rail Loop Drive, Boardman, Oregon 97818.

Following the public hearing, the Port will consider a resolution authorizing the issuance of the Bonds.

# DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Travis Lane Thomas, 43, was convicted of Menacing – Constituting Domestic Violence, a Class A Misdemeanor, and sentenced to 180 days jail time. Of that sentence, 160 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 40 hours of community service, no contact with the victim, 20 days jail time with credit for time served, and evaluation and recommended treatment for substance abuse and anger management. Additionally, the defendant was convicted of Harassment - Constituting Domestic Violence, a Class B Misdemeanor;

the sentence of 90 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 20 hours of community service, no contact with the victim, and evaluation and recommended treatment for substance abuse and anger management. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$300.

-Travis Lane Thomas, 43, was convicted of Criminal Mischief II, A Class C Misdemeanor; sentence of 15 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 20 hours of community service. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$100.

-James Robert Martin, 25, was convicted of Burglary II, a Class C Felony,

and sentenced to 18 months prison time with credit for time served, with one year post-prison supervision. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$200.

-Robert Lynn Sargent, 47, was convicted of Attempt to Commit a Class B Felony – Sexual Abuse I, A Class C Felony, and sentenced to 18 months prison time with credit for time served, as well as five years post-prison supervision, to include sex offender follow-up treatment, no form of contact with the victim, and a letter of apology to the victim. Additional counts of Unlawful Sexual Penetration I and Sexual Abuse I were disposed without conviction. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$200.

Shooters may purchase additional shots for \$20 per shot.

# Umatilla National Forest firewood permits on sale May 1

Pendleton, OR—Personal-use firewood permits for the Umatilla National Forest will go on sale this Friday, May 1, according to Kevin Martin, Forest Supervisor. Permits are available at all Umatilla National Forest Offices and at several local vendors.

Firewood permits can be purchased for \$5 per cord with a minimum purchase of four cords for \$20. The maximum limit for personal-use firewood on the Umatilla National Forest is 12-cords-per-household-per-year.

Vendors will sell firewood permits in four-cord packets. An additional vendor fee, up to \$2, will be charged for each four-cord, \$20 firewood permit you purchase at a local vendor. Most vendors are open early mornings, late evenings

and on the weekends. An additional fee is not charged if you purchase a permit at a Forest Service Office.

Firewood cutters will be required to keep a record of the date, time and quantity of firewood removed from the National Forest System lands. Additional information can be found in the Firewood Guide that accompanies each permit.

Mountain travel will require extreme care to avoid getting stuck or causing extensive and illegal resource damage to the land and vegetation. Firewood cutters are required to carry an axe, a shovel, an eight-ounce capacity or larger fire extinguisher, and have their chainsaw equipped with an approved spark arrester when cutting wood.

As we move into the

hot, dry summer months, Public Use Restrictions (PURs) may be implemented. Restrictions will be announced by 6 p.m. on the day prior to the restriction(s) going into effect. Weekend restrictions will be announced by 6 p.m. on Friday. Updated PURs will be posted on a recorded message at 1-877-958-9663 and on the forest's website. It is the public's responsibility to check if firewood cutting is allowed, restricted to specific hours of the day, or prohibited.
