for students and 25 cents for adults, as per federal mandate.

The federal “Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act” required the district to increase meal prices to meet federal “equity pricing requirements.”

Elementary school lunches will rise from \$2.35 per lunch to \$2.45; junior/senior lunches will rise from \$2.60 to \$2.70; adult lunches will increase from \$3 to \$3.25; and milk will increase from .40 to .50 cents.

Reduced-price lunches were .40 cents each, but now will be free, as the result of a vote by state legislators.

There will be no changes for breakfast, which is \$1 for elementary school students and \$1.25 for junior/senior high school students.

There will be no change for reduced price breakfast, which remains free.

In other business, the board:
