



Precipitation totaled The men of St. Patrick's Catholic Church of Heppner 0.35 inches during July, and St. William's Catholic Church of Ione will hold their which was 0.02 inches above normal. Measurable precipitation of at least .01 inch was received on two days with the heaviest, 0.25 inches, reported on the 11th.

Precipitation this year has reached 4.73 inches, which is 4.26 inches below normal. Since October, the at Heppner has been 8.77 inches, which is 4.28 inches below normal.

The outlook for August from NOAA's Climate Prediction Center calls for more of the same, with above-normal temperatures and near-normal precipitation. Normal highs for Heppner during August are 85.5 degrees and normal lows are 53.5 degrees. The 30year normal precipitation is 0.39 inches.

The National Weather water-year precipitation Service is an office of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, an agency of the U.S. Commerce Department.

The highest wind gust was 34 mph, which oc-
