(I do now live in Baker County.)

Let me also mention how grateful I am to my wife as I went through all the steps it took to get help from the Veterans Administration. If it wasn't for her education and helping me with paperwork, I'd still be running in circles.

In closing let me say that I'm proud to have served my country, I'm very grateful for the help the V.A. hospital in Boise, ID gives me and the considerate help and guidance that my veterans service representative Linda Skendzel gave me.
