Fish and Wildlife Commission will meet Oct. 8-9 in Florence to adopt 2016 big game hunting regulations and hear an updated Biological Status Review for wolves.

The Commission meeting on Friday, Oct. 9 starts at 8 a.m. at the Driftwood Shores Resort, 88416 First Avenue.

The Commission is expected to adopt the 2016 big game hunting regulations.

The Commission also will be briefed on the updated Biological Status Review of Wolves and evaluation of criteria to remove the gray wolf from the state Endangered Species Act. This is a briefing only; rulemaking is scheduled for the Nov. 9 meeting in Salem.
