A View from the Hill

With the calendar's beginning of the Fall season has arrived the official beginnings of popular deer and elk hunting seasons, and the Willow Creek Terrace residents who participate in morning discussions have had plenty to say about "hunting." Stories of earlier times invariably include more references to "sustenance" than to "sport," for the success of hunting efforts was important to having food on the table. Residents have also remembered the evolution of hunting during their hunting days: the need for licenses, the increasing rules and regulations, the seemingly fewer places open to public hunting, and the increasing costs.

One of the Terrace's employees is also a volunteer firefighter, so thanks is extended to Katelyn Jordan for her service.

This week is also time for another important discomfort, flu shots. Both staff and residents will endure the moments of unease for the months of protection. And speaking of "protection," Tuesday, Oct. 13, marked the origin of the U.S. Navy in 1775, and with it came recognition of the community's two Navy veterans, Kenneth Peck and Marj Burgess.

Since Thursday is "National Cake Decorating Day," the residents on the Hill will have an opportunity to exercise their skills in decorating individual cakes. Getting the creative juices flowing should be fun, and later eating the results should be a fitting reward.
