to move into their new home beside the Morrow County Courthouse.

According to Morrow County Human Resources Director Karen Wolff, the movers are here this week moving furniture out of storage and into the new building, with the goal of having the building ready for use by the end of the week. Movers will return early next week to complete the move. Employees will spend Nov. 4 unpacking and settling in; they expect to be open next Thursday.
