

Temporary job openings for the 2016 field season require early online application

Pendleton—Are you thinking about a summer job working in the beautiful Blue Mountains? The Umatilla National Forest is looking to fill a number of temporary job openings for the 2016 field season

and this year's timeline to submit applications is much earlier than in years past. This year, applications for summer temporary employment will need to be submitted online at www.usajobs.gov during

an eight-day period that begins Nov. 30 and extends through Dec. 7. Interested applicants are encouraged to create their USAjobs profile now to begin developing their application and compiling the required

documentation. Positions are available include wildland firefighting, timber, silviculture, developed recreation, trails and land survey.

Position descriptions, duty locations, grade levels and hiring manager contact information for the 2016 temporary positions are posted on the Umatilla National Forest's website at: www.fs.usda.gov/Umatilla/.

Duty locations may include district offices in Walla Walla and Pomeroy, WA and Heppner, Ukiah and Pendleton, OR as well as several remote guard stations and lookouts scattered throughout the forest.

Sheriff's Report

September 7 (cont.): -A man in Irrigon reported that he had all his air tools stolen out of his garage.

-MCSO received report of a Toyota mini truck unloading a side-by-side; it appears they planned to take the side-by-side out into the field. MCSO made contact with three male subjects and issued a verbal warning for unlawful use of an ATV on roadway and advised them not to drive in the turkey shoot.

-A driver in the Boardman area reported that it looked like a bullet just struck his windshield. The caller was still driving and requested to meet with a deputy in Boardman.

-A male in Irrigon had called several times to try to get permission to burn in Irrigon at his residence.

He was advised by dispatch that Irrigon has not lifted its district burn ban. He got very upset on the phone and said he would file complaints against the fire department to the State Fire Marshal. The subject was given the number for the State Fire Marshal.

-MCSO received report of a black cow dying behind a residence in Irrigon.

-A male in Boardman reported that his yellow, '67 Ford pickup was stolen sometime in the previous two days. He advised he had no idea who took it.

-The park ranger at Threemile Campground, Boardman advised MCSO that there was a red Ford Explorer at the first camp and he had given them until tomorrow to leave. The caller gave dispatch a plate number that did not return to a Ford Explorer. The ranger asked to have the camper checked and the vehicle looked at.

The caller requested a Morrow County Sheriff's Deputy come and make him leave. **September 11:** -A caller in Heppner advised Morrow County Sheriff's Office that there were people riding four-wheelers down Main Street. -MCSO received a report of a suspicious vehicle at Threemile Canyon Farms, Boardman.
