So, after wife Barb Watkins drew the lettering for the message on the sign, he proceeded to drill quarter-inch holes along the lettering, through which he pushed white Christmas lights—nearly 2,000 holes for nearly 2,000 lights.

Watkins, who describes himself as a die-hard Mustang fan, says some people ask him if the sign wasn't a lot of work, to which he replies, "Not nearly as much work as those kids and coaches put in."

This is the second time Watkins has constructed a Christmas greeting for a victorious Mustang team. The first was after the Mustang football state championship in 1992. That time, he said, he didn't have a shop in which to construct the sign.

"They got these huge, big plyboards and he brought it into my living room," remembers Barb Watkins. "He started drilling holes for this sign, wood chips flying everywhere."

This time, however, Watkins constructed the impressive sign in a security of his shop. He did note, though, that he could see a way to save himself some work in the future.

"I'm going to save this sign this time," he says. "I told coach Grant and coach Payne that it would be real easy to turn that five into a six or an eight."
