

Refugee to speak at Ione church

Blema Fangamou, who spent years in a refugee camp in Africa, will discuss his experience and God's role in his deliverance at Ione Community Church on Sunday, Dec. 27, at 11 a.m.

Fangamou was targeted for death in the civil war in his home country, Guinea-Bissau, in 1998. He made his way mainly on foot to a United Nations refugee camp in Benin, more than 2,000 miles away. His wife and six children also had to flee. Their story is documented in the 2013 book "God Doesn't Write with a Pen" by Christi Lynn Pauline.

He now lives and works in Boardman, and supports a medical clinic in his former refugee camp. Everyone is invited to the worship service; the scripture reading for the day reminds us that the infant Jesus and his family were also once refugees.
