DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Richard John Fisher, 56, was convicted of Assault IV, a Class A Misdemeanor. Sentence of 180 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include

30 hours of community service, no contact with the victim, and successful completion of anger management evaluation and any recommended treatment. Further counts were disposed without conviction. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$600.

-Travis Lane Thomas, 44, was convicted of Car-

rying a Concealed Weapon, a Class B Misdemeanor. Sentence of 180 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 30 hours of community service and forfeiture of evidence to the State of Oregon. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$200.

Sheriff's Report

November 4: -Morrow County Sheriff's Office received a complaint from a person in Irrigon who said he had called before about his neighbor not having any hay for their horses. The caller advised they now have another horse and no hay. The reporting person stated they have a lot of animals on a small piece of property and would like a deputy to make contact with them. MCSO took the incident under investigation.
