## Heppner man creates a living legacy with trees

By Andrea Di Salvo Arbor Day is April 29, but local man Gerald "Jerry" Smith is a little ahead of schedule with his tree planting—about 20 years ahead.

Locals who drive down Cannon St. in Heppner may think nothing of the stand of evergreens by the site of the previous swimming pool, but those trees represent decades of care by Smith and his family.

Smith, 75, was born in southern Colorado and worked in the oil fields during his early adulthood. In 1962, his wife, Sonja, an Oregon native, persuaded him to move to Heppner, where her father worked at the local mill. Smith also in Morrow County.

Daughter Vicki Rayburn says her parents always loved the outdoors.

"When the weather started getting nice, they were always out there working in the yard," she
