that makes the biggest mark," said Pamela Heisler, Prevention Specialist at the Children's Trust Fund of Oregon. "The pinwheel is a sign of hope, of the great childhoods all children deserve because our children are our future."

Before picking up a shovel, pick up fne telephone. Electric, water, sewer, natural gas, telephone and cable television lines often are buried underground. One wrong move can cause you and your neighbors to be cut off from vital services - or cause death or injury to you, from an electric shock or an explosion. At least two business days before you plan to dig, call your state's one-call center, or your local utilities. Affected utility companies will come out and use color-coded paint to mark the location of underground utilities. Calling ahead not only is common sense. In some states, it is the law!
