## Sheriff's Report

**February 6:** -Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report of a young kid about 18 years old trespassing on a property in Irrigon. When confronted, he claimed he had lost his glasses. The caller had walked him off the property but the kid advised he would be back. MCSO responded.

-MCSO was advised of information regarding missing runaway juveniles at Sub Zero Motel in Irrigon. A deputy responded and located a runaway juvenile female.

-A female reported that she hit a deer on Hwy. 74 near Lone that morning. She advised she was not injured but wanted to know if the deer could be donated to a shelter for food. A deputy and ODOT were advised.

-Oregon State Police advised MCSO that an off-duty trooper on I-84 east was following a black-tarped semi truck that was all over the road, unknown if the issue was medical, intoxicants or if the driver

was tired. A deputy contacted the driver; OSP was advised of findings and would watch for the subject.

-Subjects advised MCSO that they had crashed in the Boardman area and were fighting in front of the vehicle. It was a single vehicle accident, injuries unknown. Subjects exchanged information.

-A female in Heppner advised a male subject was intoxicated and was kicked out of the bar. She reported that he came home and was yelling at the female; he threw her across the kitchen and was trying to hit her head on the counter tops. MCSO arrested Eric Michael Masterson, 24.

**February 7:** -Emergency personnel received report of an extremely intoxicated female in her 40s in Boardman, breathing but with white saliva from her mouth. Boardman PD and Boardman ambulance responded and the patient was transported to Good Shepherd Hospital.

-A female reported to

MCSO that someone hit her at a karaoke event in Boardman. MCSO and Boardman PD responded.

-MCSO received report of cows out on the road on Hwy. 207 - Echo, Lexington. The caller advised that another person stopped and ran the cows off the road, but it appeared the fence was down and would need to be fixed. A deputy was advised and advised it was open range. The cattle owner was contacted and advised of the issue.

-MCSO was advised of a llama heading toward the freeway by Boardman. A deputy responded and the llama went back into the tree farm. Oregon State Police was advised and the incident was taken under investigation.

-A deputy was out at Baseline Ln./Hwy. 207 - Echo attempting to locate a subject involved in a disturbance in Umatilla. The subject was located and transported to Umatilla PD. Stanley Oneil McKnight, 29, was cited for driving uninsured and warned for an expired registration.

-A male advised MCSO that there was a vehicle at Willow Creek Reservoir, Heppner and that the person inside was "messed up." A deputy responded and contacted the male. Heppner ambulance was stood down.

-Benton County, WA advised MCSO that they received a 911 call plotting to the Irrigon area from what sounded like a juvenile male, who said, "I will kill her." MCSO and Oregon State Police responded but were unable to locate an emergency or the source of the call.

-OSP advised MCSO that they arrested Amanda Suzanne Vaughan, 41, on

a Morrow County Circuit Court warrant for Failure to Appear on Interfering with a Peace Office and FTA on Theft III.

-MCSO was advised of a dark gray SUV going over 100 mph on I-84 west. Curtis Dean Belcher, 46, was arrested and released on his own recognizance for Driving Under influence of Intoxicants, to be notified by the District Attorney and given a citation.

**February 8:** -Morrow County Sheriff's Office was advised of a motor vehicle accident near the gravel pit toward Ruggs on Hwy. 206 - Condon. The caller did not think it rolled but advised the driver couldn't get out. MCSO, Heppner fire and Heppner ambulance responded and the patient was transported to Pioneer Memorial Hospital.

-MCSO was advised that Joseph A. Manning, 30, was brought into Umatilla County Jail from Snake River Correctional Institution on two Irrigon Justice Court warrants for Failure to Appear on Driving While Suspended and FTA on Harassment.

-MCSO received a juvenile complaint regarding five- and ten-year-olds trying to start their grandmother's car. MCSO responded and made contact with the juveniles, who advised they were just packing stuff up for their grandma.

-MCSO received report of possible drive-by shooting in Boardman. The caller advised a car went by and her horses went running; her son found some shells but no horses were injured as far as she could tell. The caller advised she heard four to five shots and saw a slower vehicle pass when they heard it. The neighbors

heard it as well. MCSO took the incident under investigation.

**February 9:** -Douglas Charles Haggard Jr., 38, was served an Irrigon justice Court warrant for Failure to Appear on Theft II. The subject was already lodged with the Dept. of Corrections and was given a trial date and time with the justice court.

-MCSO was advised that the pop machine outside of the Lone store was broken into and the whole change mechanism taken. The Coca-Cola workers were on scene and the caller requested contact.

-Dept. of Human Services advised MCSO of a suicidal female in Heppner. MCSO made contact with the female, who was fine and had family staying with her.

-A man in the Heppner area advised MCSO that his horses came in all lathered up; the halter was all screwed up on the horse, and on the other horse there were claw marks on the butt but no blood. The caller advised he though a cougar was harassing his animals since his dog had been missing for a few days.

**February 11:** -A male in Heppner advised that someone had taken his morphine pills the night before.

-MCSO was advised of a little girl running up and down the street in Irrigon, crying and screaming that there was a fight.

-MCSO and Boardman PD responded to a report of a wrong-way driver on I-84 west. Joseph Morancie, 52, was arrested and released on his own recognizance for Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants. The subject was also cited for failing to register.

## DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Dillion Scott Carter, 18, was convicted of Burglary I, a Class A Felony. Thirty custody units were converted to 30 days jail time, to run consecutive to any other sentences with credit for time served, and the defendant sentenced to three years supervised probation, subject to 180 sanction units with 90 jail units. Probation conditions include substance abuse evaluation, mental health evaluation, 10 non-custody sanction units to be used for 160 hours of community service, and no contact with listed individuals.

Carter was additionally convicted of Theft II, a Class C Felony. Ten custody units were converted to 10 days jail time, to run consecutive to other sentences, with credit for time served, and the defendant sentenced to 18 months supervised probation subject to 90 sanction units with 30 jail units. Probation conditions are the same as above with the exception of five non-custody sanction units converted to 80 hours of community service. Additional counts were disposed without conviction. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$400.

-Patrick Shane Hardie, 49, was convicted of Disorderly Conduct II, a Class B Misdemeanor, and the defendant sentenced to 15 days jail time with credit for time served. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$100.
