Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following

 Catarino Birjilio Martinez, 21, was found guilty of Possession of Methamphetamine, a Class C Felony. The defendant's driver's license was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 18 months supervised probation, subject to 90 sanction units with 30 jail units, probation conditions to include 60 hours of community service and 10 days jail time with credit for time served. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$500.

 Catarino Birjilio Martinez, 21, was found guilty of Failure to Appear I, a Class C Felony, and sentenced to 24 months supervised probation, probation conditions to include 40 hours of community service. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$200.

## **Justice** Court Report

Morrow County Justice of the Peace Ann Spicer has released the following Justice Court report:

-Shawn Glenn Eaton, 53, of Littleton, CO was found guilty of No Aquatic **Invasive Species Permit** and fined \$50.

-Joshua Travis Peck, 41, was found guilty of Driving While Suspended or Revoked and Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants (DUII). Of the sentence of 180 days jail time, 150 days were suspended and the defendant sentenced to 30 days jail time, to run concurrent with the following case. The defendant also had his driver's license suspended for three years and was sentenced to 150 hours community service and three years bench probation, probation conditions to include attending a Victims Impact Panel. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$2,862.

-Joshua Travis Peck, 41, was found guilty of an additional count Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants. Of the sentence of 180 days jail time, 178 days were suspended and the defendant sentenced to two days jail time, to run concurrent with the previous case. The defendant also was sentenced to three years bench probation, probation conditions to include attending a Victims Impact Panel. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$1,862.


