-Continued from PAGE ONE Forest. Condon and Fossil are a thoroughfare to the 'Painted Hills' and the John Day River Scenic Byway.

"Our communities also offer several local events that would attract people to the area, such as the St. Patrick's celebration in Heppner, Morrow County Fair and Rodeo, and PRCA Rodeo, Fourth of July events in Condon, Fossil, and Ione, and many other events throughout the year."

The co-op says it also hopes that, by installing these four stations, it will help in some way with the connectivity to the east side of the state for electric car owners, providing another location for them to charge their cars while heading east. There also are electric car charging stations in Arlington and Mitchell, and electric car owners have access a phone app that shows exactly where all of the car charging stations are located on their route,

so they can then plan their trip accordingly.

"Columbia Basin Electric has had a lot of very

-Zone No. 2: Territory served or to be served by the cooperative within the incorporated city limits of Heppner.

-Zone No. 5: Territory served or to be served by the cooperative lying south of the township line dividing Township 2 South and 3 South and East of the Morrow-Gilliam County line and in Wheeler County that area east of the range line between Range 24 East and 25 East.

-Zone No. 6: Territory served or to be served by the cooperative within the

incorporated city limits of Condon.

Each position is a three-year term. The members of the nominating committee are:
