-A caller in Boardman advised there were people yelling in his front yard. He advised he could hear someone yelling, "Let go of the knife." BPD and MCSO responded.

November 3: -A subject in Boardman advised she was going grocery shopping and was told to call the police department every time they were going to leave the house for a little while. A card with the 24-hour dispatch number was left on the subject's door.

-Boardman PD responded to an intoxicated subject refusing to leave Boardman Select Market.

-A Boardman Police officer issued a warning for a boat parked in front of a fire hydrant.

-The front desk clerk at Rodeway Inn in Boardman advised a person in the hotel reported there was a guy tripping and acting crazy and saying thing like there was a bomb and telling them not to go into their room because there was someone in there already. Boardman PD and Morrow County Sheriff's Office responded. The subject returned to his room and would be going to bed. There was no bomb.
