
Mustangs show well in weight classes in home tournament

Two Mustangs earned their way to the finals match under the light on Saturday evening and two other Mustangs placed in the top four of their weight class.

Trevor Antonucci fought back after falling behind early in the semifinals to win by pin over

a Riverside opponent. He was defeated in the championship bout by a Baker wrestler and settled for a silver medal.

Cord Flynn easily won his way to the championship bout and found little resistance there as he won by an 18-3 technical fall.

Flynn not only won the gold medal but was also awarded the tournament Outstanding Wrestler trophy by vote of the coaches.

Leo Waite went 2-1 for the tournament and finished with a bronze medal and third place. His two wins were by fall over Baker and Enterprise opponents.

Zach Bredfield finished fourth at 145 pounds; he made it to the semi-finals before suffering his first
