Ione fourth graders take off on IXL

Students in Jessa Bigsby's fourth-grade classroom are participating in an immersive K-12 learning experience that provides comprehensive, standards-aligned content for math, language arts, science and social studies, called IXL.

Students work electronically to answer questions in core subject areas and work at their own pace. The program automatically knows when a student has mastered something by the number of questions answered correctly. If students don't answer questions correctly, a series of more probing questions is provided to get them to a point where they will be considered a master.

"The best thing about this program is that, rather than just telling a student that the question is wrong, the program will explain the why of the correct answer," said Bigsby. "It been a hit in my classroom and I'm seeing significant improvements in my students test scores and spelling tests. I'm anxious to see how it improves our state test scores."

As students meet certain marks, they're rewarded with whimsical awards that help students celebrate milestones and motivate them to meet the next challenge. Real-time data also alerts the teacher when students need help so they can step in the moment it's needed. From students' strengths and weaknesses to their progress on state standards, IXL helps teachers refine their instructional strategies to have the greatest impact on their students.

Students in Bigsby's class say they are very excited to work with IXL.

"It's very fun and so much better than writing," says Michael McElligott, while Liam Heideman says he works to get the awards at the end. "I want to answer 3,000 questions before the end of the school year," he says.

"My favorite part is the language arts part," says Victoria De La Torre. "I really like compounds, suffixes and prefixes."
