 temperatures averaged 54.2 degrees, which was 0.7 degrees below normal. The highest was 69 degrees on the 15th. Low temperatures averaged 35.6 degrees, which was 2.1 degrees above normal. The lowest was 28 degrees, on the fifth.

There were seven days with the low temperature below 32 degrees.

Precipitation totaled 1.91 inches during March, which was 0.39 inches above normal. Measurable precipitation of at least .01 inch was received on 17 days with the heaviest, 0.27 inches, reported on the 27th.

Precipitation this year has reached 4.04 inches, which is 0.07 inches below normal. Since October, the water-year precipitation at Heppner has been 8.36

inches, which is 0.19 inches above normal.

The highest wind gust was 45 mph, which occurred, predictably, during the St. Patrick's Day celebration on March 18th.

The outlook for April from NOAA's Climate Prediction Center calls for near-normal temperatures and near-normal precipitation. Normal highs for Heppner rise from 59 degrees at the start of April to 64 degrees at the end of April. Normal lows rise from 36 degrees to 40 degrees. The 30-year normal precipitation is 1.51 inches.

The National Weather Service is an office of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, an agency of the U.S. Commerce Department.

DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Cynthia Ann Brown, 28, was convicted of Harassment, a Class B Misdemeanor. Execution of the sentence of 90 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 18 months bench probation, to include 10 hours of community service and no offensive contact with the victim. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$200.

-Luis Alberto Nunez, 31, was convicted of Harassment, a Class B Misdemeanor. Execution of the sentence of 90 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 40 hours of community service and no contact with the victim.
