Greenup, Lien receive college golf honors

Two Heppner youth, Blake Greenup and Chris Lien, have distinguished themselves on the college golf scene as their teams took college conference victories. Both Greenup and Lien also received all-conference honors for their performance in the championships.

Greenup, 20, is a junior at Lewis-Clark State College, Lewiston, ID. She was named to Second Team All-Conference, as well as receiving the Champion of Character award for the 2017 Frontier Conference Golf League.

The honors came after the conference championship in Tempe, AZ, where the Lewis-Clark Warriors women's team took the championship.

Greenup led her team in scoring through the first days of the tournament to finish fifth overall as an

individual with a score of 246. She will travel with the Warriors to play in the NAIA National Championships at the PGA National Fazio Course in Palm Beach Gardens, FL May 23.

Lien, 25, is a senior at Lewis-Clark State College. He was a first-team conference pick and was named Player of the Year for the conference. Lien also was awarded with the Champions of Characters award for the team.

Lien led his team to the Frontier Conference championship with a 215, one-under for the tournament. His 69 in the final round was a tournament low in the three rounds. In rounds 1-2, he posted back-to-back 73s. Lien and the rest of the Lewis-Clark Warriors will travel to TPC Deere Run in Moline, IL for the NAIA National Championships May 16.

-Continued from PAGE ONE manufacturers themselves, the InterMountain ESD & CTE Consortium and Blue Mountain Community College.

The grant will fund three activities to connect students to manufacturing careers:

-Field trips for students to visit local regional industries.

-Videography services to film and produce documentaries featuring regional manufacturing careers; these videos will be posted online.

-Instructional resources for introducing students to the manufacturing skills

used in regional industries.

"The big idea is that we need to grow our own employees in eastern Oregon and ensure that manufacturing partners in the region are connected to educators and students. The Eastern Oregon Workforce Board is working diligently to support local industry by finding avenues to recruit and retain skilled workers, who can contribute to thriving communities," said Jennifer Pambrun, IMESD

Regional CTE Coordinator.

The student field trips are happening this spring. An "Introduction to Manufacturing" curriculum and other instructional resources available through an online hub will be implemented by September 2017.
