HCC secretary Claudia Smythe reports that the grant organization requires the facade to be designed with the original tall doors and double-decker windows. The current plans for door designs have been approved by the state, which prefers that the Hardman center strengthen the existing window frames with metal rather than going to larger wood frames.
