15, the IMESD also named the recipient of the 2017 Community Partner Award, which is Umatilla County Public Health. This agency has been a leader in the area of school-based health through the creation of Wellness Hubs. These hubs provide on-site support in the areas of nursing, mental health, oral health and system navigation in schools across the region. The Hub design utilizes braided resources to expand capacity—a model built for replication across the state.

"Umatilla Public Health is highly committed to eastern Oregon families. By partnering with other agencies that serve the public, they have increased

capacity for students and families in need. Public health is always willing to come to the table, innovate and allocate resources in a creative way," said Dr. Mark Mulvihill, IMESD superintendent.
