The defendant was also sentenced to one year post-prison supervision. An additional count of Fail-Driver – Property Damage was dismissed. Fines totaled \$200.

-Joshua William Strong, 22, was convicted of one count of Harassment, a Class B Misdemeanor. The sentence of 90 days jail time was suspended and the defendant sentenced to 36 months bench probation, to include 20 hours of community service, mental health evaluation, and no offensive contact with the victim. A second count of harassment was dismissed. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$200.
