-Continued from PAGE ONE "fore you went to work," Mudie recalls. "You went to work and then they gave you classes." While there, Mudie worked as an aide but took classes, training to be a certified medication assistant (CMA). Around 1982, she took the state board exams at Blue Mountain Community College, achieving her CMA certification.

Elizabethan Manor, and no longer had need for someone with Mudie's training. Mudie, single by that time, also fell in love. "One of the girls I worked with introduced me to her father, and we got together," says Mudie. "She always says she picked out her own mom." She moved to Ione to be closer to her soon-to-be husband, Allan Basford. The couple married, creating a combined family of eight children. Mudie went to work at Pioneer Memorial around 1993, starting as an aide in the nursing home

and working occasionally in the hospital. Among her duties was taking vitals, caring for patients, and dealing with the patients' daily activities. "When they closed the nursing home, I worked nights in the hospital with the nurse there. When they put in the long-term care facility I finished out my time there," she recalls. In fact, Mudie officially retired about two years ago, but has stayed on, being on call or filling in occasionally as needed. All in all, she has worked nearly 40 years in health care, with almost half that time spent at Pioneer Memorial. Now, though, she says it's time to let it go.

However, now in retirement, she says, "I'm not bored. People ask me if I'm bored, and I always tell them I have plenty to do." Mudie says she has a list of things she's looking forward to in retirement. "I'm going to take it easy and enjoy my friends. I like gardening, so I'm going to garden. I do Stampin' Up with friends, making my own cards." Of course, at the top of her list are those eight children, along with 27 grandchildren and 19 great-grandchildren (with the 20th expected in March). Mudie says she plans to visit all of them, a highlight of her free time. "All the children call me Grandma. I think I'm so very, very blessed to be called Mom and Grandma," she says.
