

Sheriff's Report

Morrow County Sheriff's Office released the following information:

September 5: Morrow County Sheriff's Office and ODFW responded to a dog complaint at Moose Lodge on NE Third St, Irrigon. House two doors down has a dog screaming at the top of its lungs for hours and owners are doing nothing.
