Morrow County and Nov. 2016 in Umatilla County and is serving five years of probation, which includes a provision not to possess weapons, firearms or dangerous animals

Morrow County Sheriff Ken Matlack said Haak has been on leave during the investigation, per the officer-involved shooting plan, which is in the process of review.

The plan does not provide a timeframe for when an officer should return to work after a shooting, Matlack said, while most

agencies specify a period of 48 or 72 hours. Matlack said the sheriff's office is looking to change the period to something like no sooner than 48 hours to create some certainty and line up with other agencies.

Haak, of Heppner, was a parole and probation officer in Morrow County until summer 2016, when he moved into a deputy vacancy at the sheriff's office. He graduated in January from the basic police course at the Oregon Public Safety Academy, Salem.

Free vision exams October 23

The Morrow County Health Department, Morrow County Health District and Oregon Health Sciences University (OHSU) Casey Eye Institute are offering free vision screenings to adults age 18 and older who do not have vision insurance. The outreach program helps decrease preventable blindness for at-risk community members by screening for glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy and macular degeneration. Through this partnership each participant will receive information on obtaining glasses and as-

sistance from the Morrow County Health Department for coordination with follow up care as needed.

The service will be provided on Monday, Oct. 23rd and is scheduled by appointment only by calling the Morrow County Health Department at 541-676-5421. Appointments are available from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the St. Patrick's Catholic Church Parish Hall, 525 N. Gale Street, Heppner.

Eyeglasses will be available for a nominal fee (\$30 single vision and \$40

lined bifocal). Based on income, participants may be eligible for financial assistance through the Heppner Lions Club.

Powered by the generous gifts of donors and volunteers, the fully outfitted ophthalmology lane aboard the Casey Vision Screening mobile van provides much needed eye exams at no cost to low income, uninsured and underinsured Oregonians.
