

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Department has released the following information:

September 23: Morrow County Sheriff's Office responded to I84 E, Boardman. RP advised that driver in silver F150 is swerving and cannot maintain speed. Caller was transferred to OSP.

-Suspicious Activity at Irrigon High School on SE Wyoming Ave., Irrigon. Sgt got a report that there was an adult subject doing something suspicious at the high school. Deputy responded and no one was around. Unfounded.
