The Board of Commissioners has entered an order declaring its intent to form an agricultural educational extension district, to be known as the

Morrow County Extension Service District. It intends that the boundaries of said District will include all territory within Morrow County including all territory within the incorporated cities in the County. The Board of Commissioners will hear testimony and receive written comment about Extension Service needs, economic feasibility and a permanent tax rate limit. The Board will determine if the County could be benefited by the formation of a County Extension Service District. All interested persons may appear and be heard.
