The community supported the team well as the stands were packed with many cheering fans. After a slow start, the Mustangs trailed 5-0. They then went on an 11-0 run to secure the lead and never looked back.

Sydney Wilson had another great game leading all scorers with 26 points and grabbing 13 total rebounds. Her free throw shooting helped the Mustangs keep the lead late in the game

as she made 10 of 11 from the charity stripe. Senior Morgan Correa had an outstanding game scoring nine points and leading the team in assists. She additionally did well at the free throw line shooting six for eight. Junior Jacee Currin made a huge contribution by playing solid defense on the Cobra's top player, holding her to a mere eight points. Currin added six points of her own and was the leader on the floor. Sophie Grant added five points, Madison Combe three points and Kacie Gray one point.
