Current programs and research currently offered by Morrow County Extension include: 4-H Youth Development, Juntos and Latino Outreach, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Education Program (SNAP-Ed), Livestock and Rangeland Management, Cereal Crops Agriculture as well as being served by the Hermiston Agricultural Research and Extension center that serves irrigated agriculture and Columbia Basin Agricultural Research center outside of Pendleton that serves dryland producers in the county.

"Extension has a local history of adapting to the needs of local communities with a focus on healthy farms, families and food over the past 100 years.
