Health care providers encourage healthy youth

Columbia River Health and Morrow County Health District are providing services that expand healthy opportunities for all adolescents ages 12-21 by offering well care exams.

Young people who can easily access preventive health services are more likely to develop healthy behaviors and lay a foundation for a healthier lifestyle that persists into adulthood. Physical, social and emotional changes during adolescence increase the need for continuous, comprehensive preventive services and the American Medical Association's Guidelines for Adolescent Preventive Services, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Bright Futures Guidelines, and the American Academy of Pediatrics

all recommend comprehensive yearly check-ups for adolescents.

During a well care appointment, the health care professional conducts a comprehensive exam which addresses physical, behavioral and oral health. This is a great time for adolescents and their parents to talk with the health care provider about any concerns they might have and the exam can be used to satisfy the sport physical evaluation to participate in school activities. Insurance is not required and there will be no out of pocket cost.

Several adolescent well care events will take place throughout the summer but appointments may be scheduled anytime with a health care provider.
