The bids will be publicly opened and read at the Morrow County Public Works Department, 365 West Highway 74, Lexington, Oregon, at 4:00 p.m. local time on Thursday, May 24, 2018. First Tier Subcontractor Disclosure Forms will be accepted until 5:00 p.m. on date of the bid opening.
