## Seniors participate in stock market game

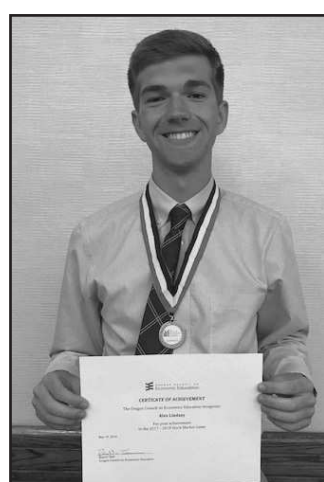
In September 2017, Mr. John Flaherty required his senior students to compete individually in the Oregon Stock Market Game. The Stock Market Game is an online simulation of the global capital markets that engages students grades four-12 in the world of economics and prepares them for financially independent futures.

Over a 10-week session, the stock market game teaches students the fundamentals of personal finance and investing, while practicing skills in math, economics, social studies and other subjects. In the game, students form teams or can compete as individu-

als to build and manage an investment portfolio in the real-world, dynamic marketplace.

There are award divisions for fall and spring elementary, middle school and high school, as well as full-year awards for each category. This year, Alex Lindsay took third place in the full-year high school age division. Alex competed against thousands of other students in Oregon and hundreds of teams. Alex is the first student from Heppner to place in this contest.

The Oregon Stock Market Game is sponsored by the Oregon Council on Economic Education, an
